

English

This half-term we are reading Arthur and the Golden Rope, where we will be focussing on writing a newspaper article, and a persuasive letter to Thor to try and ask for his help to battle the grey wolf. The second half of term will see us studying Beowulf focussing on writing our own myth focussing on one of the Viking gods. In all of our writing we will be ensuring that the grammar, punctuation and spelling that is required in Year 4 is understood and applied accurately. Reading books should come into school

Mathematics

Our focus this term is addition and subtraction strategies, using the column method to help us with these questions. The children will also be using exchanging when a number bridges 10. This can be quite challenging, as the children will often forget about the number they have exchanged. This will be a key concept for us over the coming weeks to ensure that the children are secure with this knowledge. As always, the children will be focusing on their rapid recall of times tables facts. Please

continue to use Times Tables Rockstars at home to help support this.

Science

In Science we will be learning about animals including humans. As part of this unit, we will be looking at our teeth and thinking about the different functions our teeth have. This leads up to our learning on the digestive system and the journey our food goes on once it enters our mouth.

Wider Curriculum

This half-term we will be studying the Vikings. We will be learning about who the Vikings were and where they came from. We will look at what made their army effective, thinking about how they travelled to England and what their life was like. In art, we will be building on our Year three work on colour mixing and looking at colour wheel to make secondary and the tertiary colours. In RE, we will be looking at Christianity and the symbols special to Christmas, thinking about what these mean to us. In Computing, we will be learning about Google Sheets, conducting and presenting our own data.
